### 'Success for Today, Prepared for Tomorrow'

As we break for the summer, we celebrate another successful year at Maltby Academy. Our dedicated team of talented staff, leaders and governors, supportive parents/carers and most crucially, our inspirational young people are moving the Academy to the next level of performance. We are predicting excellent 2016 examination results in August and with improving overall attendance and engagement in learning, we have set the foundation upon which to build again in September.

# **Curriculum Offer**

Academy leaders continue to be fully committed to a broad and balanced curriculum offer, including a high quality Performing Arts experience for all students. However, it is important that provision is constantly reviewed to ensure that the offer continues to engage and inspire students and provides appropriate progression routes. The Academy is currently reviewing Music provision, as part of the broader Creative and Performing Arts experience but this has been removed in its current form from the formal taught timetable from September 2016. In accordance with feedback from students, we will provide high quality extra-curricular opportunities including a vocal group, music technology and much more. The peripatetic service will also remain available and those students who have frozen their GCSE Music option this year, will continue with GCSE Music from September 2017. Parents and carers will receive a further update next term.
