

Whole School Approach to Mental Health

Within a context of stretched public resources and raised thresholds, schools are increasingly at the forefront of early intervention and preventative services; this is especially true for mental health. With 1 in 10 children aged 5-16 years reportedly having a clinically diagnosed mental disorder, the case for providing accessible mental health interventions has never been stronger.

However, when considering the role of today's schools as the hub of their community, the implications for mental health go wider than just students themselves.

Rotherham MAST is a strand of the Maltby Learning Trust which has developed a whole school approach to mental health. The service works with schools to develop appropriate mental health interventions for its learning communities which addresses the needs of students, their families and staff in schools.

During this half day workshop, Rotherham MAST will consider the prevalence and impact of poor mental health in relation to school communities, share good practice and consider how schools might resource a sustainable service model themselves.



The Trainers

The workshop will be delivered by Dave Sutton and Sara Graham.

Dave joined Maltby in 2007 and quickly established himself as an advocate for the children and young people across the learning community. He successfully led the planning and consultation for the first Academy in Rotherham and was instrumental in establishing the Maltby Learning Trust. Under his leadership the Academy secured a 'Good' judgement for overall effectiveness and 'Outstanding' for leadership and management in the 2012 OFSTED inspection. The school has seen a significant increase in attainment and progress with the 5A*-C (including English and Mathematics) headline moving from 29% in 2007 to 71% in 2013. Following the improvement journey at Maltby Academy the school was accredited as a National Support School and Dave was awarded National Leader of Education status.

Sara is an experienced counsellor who has worked with children in both primary and secondary school settings for over 12 years. She has also worked as a GP Practice Counsellor.

Sara has extensive experience of service development including mental health services for children and families, and training for professionals. She is employed by the Maltby Learning Trust and has led on the implementation of Rotherham MAST, as well as developing the whole school community approach which is the focus of today's workshop.
