






Speak Out Challenge

NHS Apprenticeships Webinar


Y10 and Post 16 Health and Social Care students, along with Post 16 CAB students participated in a webinar about apprenticeships in the NHS. They were informed of:

The match experience was also really enjoyable despite the result and the cold, showing our students a realistic level of football they could aspire to for their next steps in the game.






Careers: Y13 Business Students - Professional Presentations
