#### **CPR Event**

One of our Year 12 students, George Mason (a fully trained St John Ambulance Volunteer), is completing an EPQ (Extended Project Qualification) course here at the Academy. EPQ is a Level 3 course, which is taken alongside A Levels. In order to complete this course, George is required to do a project on a topic of his choice. This project can be in the form of an artefact or an essay; George has chosen for his project to complete an artefact on CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). George is aware that not many students are able to deliver effective CPR, so the aim of his EPQ project is to raise knowledge and understanding as to how to perform CPR effectively.

George delivered fantastic 30-minute sessions to Year 8 students on how to identify if someone is in Cardiac Arrest and how to perform hands-only chest compressions to give people the best chance of survival before the arrival of an ambulance.














### Y9 Better Learners Better Workers
