Friday 3rd May:

- Morning: coach departure for Manchester Airport early morning – students will need to take a packed lunch with them
- Afternoon: Arrival in Valencia 14.20pm checking in rooms downtime

- Afternoon: coach to Valencia Airport landing in Gatwick at 19.30

1. Payment Schedule

Payment schedule already shared a few months ago

£605 pp goes to our Tour provider (NST Travel) who arranges coach transfers, flights/luggage, accommodation on a bed & breakfast basis.

£120 pp will be used for lunch and dinner, entrances to various places of interest in Valencia, bus/underground tickets when required.

2. Passports

- ALL passports must have at least 3 months remaining from 7th May 2024.
- Students without a valid passport or with one that expires before 7th August 2024 will require a new passport.
- Passports will be kept by staff and stored securely at the hostel
- Advanced Passenger Information need to be submitted in advance and <u>accurately</u> to avoid additional fees. If you have not brought your passport along tonight, please email a picture of it to <u>mgiron@maltbyacademy.com</u> so we can complete the API within the deadline

3. Covid 19

- Students born BEFORE 2006 are strongly advised to have 2x Covid jabs
- At present, for all passengers, Spain does not require any proof of vaccination, a negative test result, or a COVID-19 recovery certificate to enter the country, regardless of your vaccination status

4. Medical Conditions/ Allergies

- You will have the opportunity to list those whilst completing your consent form this will be emailed later on this term
- Any medicine will need to be given to the staff on the day of departure
- Please inform the school of ANY medical conditions that we are not currently aware of and relevant medication on the form provided tonight.
- Miss Brown and Mr. Giron to discuss with parents/carers at a later date for students with any particular medical issues.
- If you suffer from hay fever, please make sure you bring any medication/treatment such as hay fever wipes etc with you. Last year (end of March/beginning of April) we had students who suffered more with their hay fever whilst in Valencia.

5. Global Health Insurance Cards (GHICs)

- You will need to bring a GHIC (or EHIC if you still have a valid one)
- If you haven't got one, you can apply on the NHS website (it's free!)



6. Spring weather in Valencia

- Average Temperature in Valencia in early May: around 25 °C
- Fingers crossed, weather should be great and it is normally sunny/hot around that time of the year – please provide your child with appropriate SPF cream. They may also want to bring a hat.

7. Luggage (1)



All students can bring an <u>under-seat bag</u>. It is very important that you check dimensions beforehand to avoid issues at check-in

7. Luggage (2)



Checked Baggage

Check in

Max 10kg

Must be dropped at airport check-in desk before security All students have been allocated 1 piece of checked luggage each – No more than 10 kgs

8. Spending Money

- A CONSTRUCTION OF THE OWNER OF
- In general, prices in Spain are slightly below those from the UK.
- Suggested amounts vary up to £10-20/day (no more than £80 for four days)
- Bring a wallet/ purse, we're not in the position to look after large amounts of cash
- It's suggested you bring Euros and British pounds (if you want to buy something during the journey)
- There is a soft-drink bar at the hostel as well as vending machines for snacks / drinks

9. The Hostel – food and drink

- Breakfast in Valencia will be provided by the hostel.
- Students will have lunch and dinner in various places in Valencia, rather than at the hostel
- We would recommend students to consume bottled water rather than tap water in Valencia – Bottled water will be provided regularly to students
- Students should bring a refillable bottle so we can 'top them' up regularly
- Snacks in the UK are NOT included in the cost of the trip

10. The Hostel - Rooming

- We will stay at the River hostel (River Hostel Valencia)
 Spain Home River Hostel Valencia)
- Students will be sharing rooms (at present we don't have information with regards to bedroom sizes, but judging by last year's arrangements, it ranges from 6 to 10 students per room)
- Rooming to be allocated nearer the time of departure, in consultation with students

11. Expected Behaviour

- Students are representing the school at all times on the trip
- No smoking or Vaping the legal age is 18 in Spain
- No drinking alcohol the legal age is 18 in Spain
- No students of different sexes to be in the same hotel rooms AT ANY TIME.
- Any behaviour in Valencia that brings the school into disrepute will result in sanctions, and parents will be informed immediately.

12. Mobile phones

- Be aware of data roaming charges
- There is Wi-Fi in the hotel
- Please check with your phone provider what costs are for use of data in the EU
- It's recommended that students turn their data roaming off to avoid additional charges
- Bring a European 2-pin adaptor or phone charger





13. Trainers

- We will be walking a lot whilst we are in Valencia!
- Last year, we averaged around 20,000-25,000 steps per day depending on what activities we were doing.
- Please bear this in mind and ensure you bring shoes/trainers that are comfortable and suitable for walking in.
